

- **Confirmation** is a mature and public affirmation of faith and commitment to the responsibilities of Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the bishop.
- **Reception** is a rite where people who grew up in another denomination are formally **received** by the bishop into the Episcopal Church.
- **Reaffirmation** of Baptismal Vows is available to any baptized person who would like to formally recommit to the promises of baptism.
